

Debtors' Twenty-First and Twenty-Second Omnibus Objections to Certain Tier I Proofs of Claim (the "Claims Objections").

By the Claims Objections, the Debtors seek entry of orders disallowing and expunging or modifying certain claims which are either inconsistent with the Debtors' books and records, filed against non-Debtor entities or the wrong Debtor entity, or fail to provide sufficient information (collectively, the "Disputed Claims").

By order dated August 21, 2009, the Court established October 30, 2009 (the "Bar Date") as the deadline to assert a claim against any of the Debtors. On January 20, 2010, the Court entered an order approving the Debtors' Motion for Entry of an Order Establishing Procedures for Objections to Claims (the "Claims Objection Procedures Order"). Pursuant to the Claims Objection Procedures Order, the Debtors may file omnibus objections to claims.

Claims that are Inconsistent with the Debtors' Books and Records

By the Claims Objections, the Debtors object to certain of the Disputed Claims that assert a record of indebtedness that is inconsistent with the Debtors' books and records and is not otherwise supported by documentation. The Debtors request that such claims be reduced or adjusted to reflect the amounts listed on the Debtors' books and records.

Claims Containing Insufficient Information

By the Claims Objections, the Debtors object to the allowance of certain of the Disputed Claims for failure to provide sufficient information to support a finding that the Debtors are liable to the claimant. Accordingly, the Debtors request that the Court disallow and expunge such claims from the Debtors' claims register.

Non-Debtor Claims

By the Claims Objections, the Debtors object to certain of the Disputed Claims that were asserted against the Debtors but are obligations of a non-Debtor entity. The Debtors request that such claims be disallowed and expunged from the Debtors' claims register.

Wrong Debtor Claims

By the Claims Objections, the Debtors object to certain Disputed Claims that were asserted against the wrong Debtor for liabilities that are obligations of a different Debtor. The Debtors request relief to expunge and disallow such claims because each claimant has already filed an identical claim against the proper Debtor, and reclassifying such claims would result in duplicate proofs of claim.

A hearing on the Claims Objections has been scheduled for April 27, 2010 at 10:30 a.m. with a corresponding objection deadline of April 20, 2010 at 4:00 p.m.
