

Motion of Precision Medical, Inc. for Allowance and Payment of Administrative Expense (the “PMI Motion”).

By the PMI Motion, Precision Medical, Inc. (“PMI”) seeks entry of an order granting an administrative expense claim for the blow molded containers (the “Containers”) received by Bio-Lab Inc. (“Bio-Lab”) (i) within twenty days of the petition date and (ii) during the postpetition period.

PMI alleges that it has made postpetition deliveries of Containers to the Debtors from March 19, 2009 through April 5, 2009 in the amount of \$88,085.96. PMI asserts that it has reached an agreement with the Debtors on a payment structure pursuant to which the Debtors will pay down the postpetition amount owed to PMI. To the extent that amounts owed to PMI on account of postpetition deliveries of Containers remain unpaid, PMI requests that such amounts be allowed and immediately paid as administrative expenses under Bankruptcy Code section 503(b)(1).

In addition, PMI alleges that it sold and delivered Containers in the ordinary course of business to the Debtors during the twenty days preceding the petition date. PMI asserts that the amount owed to it by Bio-Lab for such Containers is \$51,704.98. Because the Containers were received by the Debtors within twenty days of the petition date, PMI believes that it is entitled to the allowance and immediate payment of an administrative expense claim pursuant to Bankruptcy Code section 503(b)(9) on account of such prepetition deliveries.
